
Let us pray together:

THE READINGS

Tanach

Isaiah 65:17-25 (Inclusive Bible)

For I am about to create a new heaven and a new earth! The things of the past will not be remembered or come to mind! Be glad and rejoice forever and ever in what I create, because I now create Jerusalem to be a joy and its people to be a delight! I will rejoice in Jerusalem, and delight in my people; no more shall the sound of weeping be heard in it or the cry of distress. No longer will there be in it an infant who lives but a few days, or old people who do not live out their days. They die as mere youths who reach but a hundred years, and those who fall short of a hundred will be thought accursed.

At last they will live in the houses they build, and eat the fruit of the vineyard they plant. They will not build for another to inhabit; they will not plant for another to eat. For the days of my people will be like the days of a tree, and my chosen ones will enjoy the fruit of their labors. They will not labor in vain or bear children doomed to die; for they are a people blessed by God. Even before they call upon me, I will answer; and while they speak, I will hear. The wolf and the lamb will feed side by side; the lion will eat straw like an ox. Serpents will be content to crawl on the ground; they will not injure or destroy in all my holy mountain," says YHWH.

The Holy Spirit has a word for each of us today.

With God's help we are listening.

Some disciples were speaking of how the Temple was adorned with precious stones and votive offerings. Jesus said, "You see all these things? the day will come when one stone won't be left on top of another—everything will be torn down." They asked, "When will this happen, Rabbi? And what will be the sign that it's about to happen?"

Jesus said, "Take care not to be misled. Many will come in my name, saying, 'I am the One' and 'The time is at hand.' Don't follow them. And don't be perturbed when you hear of wars and insurrections. These things must happen first, but the end doesn't follow immediately."

Then he said to them, "Nation will rise against nation, and empire against empire. There will be great earthquakes, plagues and famines in various places—and in the sky there will be frightening omens and great signs. But before any of this, they'll arrest you and persecute you, bringing you before synagogues and sending you to prison, bringing you to trial before rulers and governors. And it will all be because of my name—this will be your opportunity to give your testimony. So make up your minds not to worry about your defense beforehand, for I'll give you the words, and a wisdom that none of your adversaries can take exception to or contradict. You'll be betrayed even by your own parents, brothers, sisters, relatives and friends, and some of you will be put to death. Everyone will hate you because of me, yet not a hair of your head will be harmed.

By patient endurance, you'll save your lives.

I believe in the Holy Ghost; the holy catholic church; the communion of saints; the forgiveness of sins; the resurrection of the body; and the life everlasting. Amen.



Rev. Dr. Lee currently serves as the President of Pittsburgh Theological Seminary in Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania. He comes to the presidency after seven years of service as Wesley Theological Seminary as Vice President for Campus Administration and Associate Dean for Community Life. He has served on the faculties of Northern Virginia Community College and Wesley Theological Seminary and is often a

guest lecturer at workshops and seminars dealing with Christianity in the 21st century; religious difference, Christian formation, preaching, theology in the African American context, and issues affecting church leadership. Under his leadership Pittsburgh Seminary has expanded its relationships with the neighborhoods of Pittsburgh, innovated its degree offerings through hybrid and online offerings, and engaged in significant grant activity to innovate theological education in the 21st century.

Lee is a graduate of Hampton University (B.A. in music education magna cum laude), Wesley Theological Seminary (M.Div. cum laude), and Virginia Theological Seminary (D.Min. in educational leadership). Lee is married to the Rev. Chenda Innis Lee, an ordained United Methodist elder. Together, they have four daughters and reside in the East End of the city of Pittsburgh.
