This Advent, we respond to God's beckoning to us as well.


Revealing God, visit us and fill us with your Spirit. Bring your good news to life within us. Give us courage to carry your light into the injustices and shadows of this world. Amen.

THE READINGS

Tanach

Isaiah 7:10-16 (Inclusive Bible)

Once more YHWH spoke to Ahaz and said, "ask for a sign from YHWH your God; let it be deep as the netherworld, or high as the sky!"

But Ahaz answered, "I will not ask! I will not put YHWH to the test!"

Then Isaiah said, "Listen, O House of David! Is it not enough for you to weary those around you, must you also weary my God? Therefore, the Holy One will give you a sign: This young woman will become pregnant and will give birth. You will name the child Immanu-El. This child will be living on curds and honey by the time it knows how to refuse evil and do good. But before that time—before the child knows how to refuse evil and do good—the land of the two rulers you dread will be laid to waste."

The Holy Spirit has a word for each of us today.

With God's help we are listening.

Gospel

This how the birth of Jesus came about. When Jesus' mother, Mary, was engaged to Joseph, but before they lived together, she was found to be pregnant through the Holy Spirit. Joseph, her husband, an upright person unwilling to disgrace her, decided to divorce her quietly.

This was Joseph's intention when suddenly the angel of God appeared in a dream and said, "Joseph, heir to the House of David, don't be afraid to wed Mary; it is by the Holy Spirit that she has conceived this child. She is to have a son, and you are to name him Jesus—'Salvation'—because he will save the people from their sins." All this happened to fulfill what God has said through the prophet: "The virgin will be with child and give birth, and the child will be named Immanuel"—a name that means "God is with us."

When Joseph awoke, he did as the angel of God had directed, and they went ahead with the marriage. He did not have intercourse with her until she had given birth; she had a son, and they named him Jesus.
